Pre heat your oven to 150°C /130°C fanassisted (gas 2).

Remove your meat from the packaging & pat dry before cooking.

Make a Mirepoix by neatly chopping equal amounts of onion, carrot and celery or my preferred choice of celeriac, the root of the celery plus a bay leaf & a sprig of thyme.

Season the meat with sea salt & cracked black pepper before searing in a little beef dripping or rapeseed oil in a casserole dish over high heat until brown then keep to one side.

Next fry the Mirepoix until lightly coloured, add half a bottle of red wine, or a favorite local ale and reduce by two thirds then add 300ml of beef stock, 1 tablespoon tomato paste (optional) and reduce a little, thicken with a tablespoon corn flour mixed with a little cold water and stirred into the boiling broth then add the meat to the casserole (for additional flavour add a few drops Worcester sauce & a teaspoon of English mustard).

Cover & place in the centre of the oven and cook for $2^{1/2}$ to 3 hours, the meat should be tender when pierced with a skewer.

Remove from oven & pass off the juices through a fine sieve into a clean saucepan and reduce to rich, glossy gravy then pour back over the meat ready to serve.

Serve with mustard mash & seasonal brassicas.
